Hand in hand with this come significant upgrades to our streaming worship experience which include upgrades to our streaming audio through the creation of a dedicated "Production Studio" for all of our Tech Team members to utilize. We are thrilled to be able to reach more people for Jesus and continue to make Him known throughout our community.

I will continue to be the primary Preaching Pastor in the Sanctuary Worship services at 8:30 and 11:00, and will also be the primary Preaching Pastor at the 9:30 Modern Worship service called "The Orchard" held in the Worship Center. Rev. Greg Schick will resume his role as primary Peaching Pastor at Vertical Event. Our online streaming schedule will remain as it is now. We want to continue to offer a variety of worship styles and spaces so that we can cast our nets out wide into the world, and create spaces for all people to experience the love of God.

New Contemporary Service to Begin on Palm Sunday!

St. James is excited to announce an additional Contemporary Service at 11:00am on Sunday mornings beginning April 2 - Palm Sunday. This service was added to accommodate those who go to Sunday School at 9:30am.

Rev. Greg Schick, Associate Pastor of Connections, will lead the new service. "We're excited to bring back another expression of contemporary worship to St. James!", said Greg.

In order to have a 11:00 live service (Worship Center) and a live & livestreamed service (Sanctuary) at the same time the technical team required a new working space. The former Worship Center Nursery has now been transformed into a Production Studio, with the former nursery cabinetry now installed in the Print Shop. With Facilities Manager, Renee Atkinson acting as foreman and Kyle Howard, Director of Technical Services providing the technical knowledge, the former nursery is now a state-of-the-art audio & video control room for the livestreaming. The Worship Center sound booth will still be used for live worship audio, video and cameras.

"We are so excited to bring back our Vertical Event service on Sunday mornings! I know this service has meant a great deal to the church over the years and we are anticipating mighty things with its return", said David Williams, Contemporary Worship Leader.

It was a banner year for Upward Basketball as they had а recordbreaking season of participation and teams. However the reality is that Upward would not be possible without all the volunteers giving their time, effort, dedication, and so much more to make the Upward ministry

a success. A big part of that success is Upward Director, Ryan Allmon.

"It was my hope that it was a fruitful experience for all the participants, families, and volunteers involved in this ministry. It's a privilege to get to shepherd these children and to be a part of this ministry."

"I really felt a call to go and serve and not be served. I had been a part of the church for some years, but I really didn't serve the church. I knew I wasn't blessed with a great voice, so I couldn't sing in the church choir! I knew I couldn't play a musical instrument (at least not in public), so I couldn't perform in worship. I knew my gift was helping and serving other people in some capacity. But, I also knew that I could teach a kid how to dribble a basketball, I could teach a kid how to shoot, I could teach a kid how to be a good teammate, how to care about others, and share scripture with them. I feel the greatest gift we have sometimes is our ability to invest our time in someone else's life for a greater purpose and mission."

St. James' Upward Basketball program is the only one within a 50-mile radius of Central Arkansas. The next closest Upward Basketball program is 54 miles from the St. James Campus. There are Upward Basketball programs located in Hot Springs, Pine Bluff, and Searcy. We do have other Upward programs in Central Arkansas that offer other sports (soccer and football), but we (St. James) are the only Upward Basketball program offered in Central Arkansas.

Ryan says he has a lot of favorite memories of the program through the years. But, one of his favorite is having the players say the pre-game prayer at the last game of the season. "That is a tradition that our Referee Commissioner, Bart Dickinson, started years ago. He will ask if anyone wants to say our pre-game prayer and pretty much every player every year will raise their hands. That tells me that all our volunteers and coaches were in pursuit to glorify the mission of Upward."





