

# Rutter's Requiem to be presented for Good Friday Service

A Latin requiem is used traditionally in catholic churches during funeral mass services. The term "requiem", however, can also mean the music that is composed for these services as well as a much broader label to include pieces that have anything to do with death or dying and suffering.

John Rutter's setting of the Requiem, was written in 1985 and dedicated to his father who had died the year previous. Unlike most Requiems which are sung entirely in Latin, Rutter mixed the traditional Latin text with English Bible passages and words from the Book of Common Prayer.

As is often the case, Rutter composed the Requiem in stages, with one of the movements (a setting of Psalm 23, The Lord is my Shepherd) being written ten years before as a stand alone choral anthem. He first conducted the work in its entirety in another Methodist church, Lover's Lane UMC in Dallas, Texas in 1985.

The St. James Chancel Choir had intended to present Rutter's Requiem on Good Friday 2020, but due to the pandemic our plans,

obviously, had to change. We are so pleased to finally be able to present it this year. You may even find some of the movements familiar as we have presented each one in sanctuary services over the last several years. The Lord is My Shepherd has been in the choir's library for many, many decades already!

During this year's Good Friday service, Rutter's Requiem will be interspersed with scripture readings that will take us through the night following the disciples' last supper and the day of our Lord's death. Although the music and text is often quite dramatic and somber it consistently reminds us of the reason we "remember the Lord's death until he comes." The promise of new life is irrepressible in this composition as it always comes back from the despair to restate "the hope that is within you". I encourage you to come and worship with us on Good Friday, not only to hear this gorgeous work, but also to put Sunday's celebration in context of the immense price Christ was willing to pay to keep us as his own.
