## GUEST SPEAKER Rev. John David (J.D.) walt

Rev. J.D. Walt is the Founder and President of Seedbed, Inc. whose mission is to gather, connect and resource the people of God to sow for a great awakening. Seedbed, a nondenominational ministry, publishes a full complement of awakening and disciplemaking resources, hosts the annual NewRoom Conference, and connects leaders of all sorts, lay and clergy, in the work of sowing for the awakening throughout the world. In the decade prior he served as a Vice President and Dean of Chapel at Asbury Theological Seminary with locations in Kentucky, Florida, Tennessee, and Oklahoma. A speaker and conference leader, author of twenty-five books and a songwriter, J.D. has mentored pastors and worship leaders. He writes every day for The Seedbed Daily Text, a daily devotional followed by thousands of readers. He is a licensed attorney in the state of Arkansas and an ordained elder in the Texas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. He is a father of four children and lives in The Woodlands, Texas.

DR. PAUL MARTIN "MARTY" FISER

Dr. Paul Martin "Marty" Fiser attended Hendrix College where he majored in Biology, graduating in 1967. He then earned his MD at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) ('71) before pursuing residency training in Pediatrics at Shands Teaching Hospital in Gainesville, Florida. He subspecialized in Allergy and Immunology at Duke University, settling into a career as an Allergist. Marty returned to Arkansas in 1979 as a Clinical Assistant Professor in Pediatrics at UAMS and Arkansas Children's Hospital. He went into private practice as an Allergist at the Arkansas Allergy and Asthma Clinic. Marty passed away on November 20, 2013.




MARIE HARRELL CHRISTIE

Marie Harrell Christie was married to James Edward Christie for almost 60 years. Marie graduated from Stuttgart High School and attended Hendrix College, colleges in Louisiana, Southern Methodist University and Columbia University. She was active in the American Guild of Organists in Dallas, Texas and in every church choir where she and her husband served. Having married a Methodist minister, they served churches in Louisiana and Arkansas. They traveled all over the US for the General Board of Global Ministries. She passed away at the age of 90 on December 26, 2013.



#### REV. JAMES EDWARD CHRISTIE

Rev. James Edward Christie was a graduate of Hendrix College (1945) and Perkins School of Theology of SMU (1948). He began his ministry as associate pastor at First Methodist Church, Texarkana. He continued his ministry serving churches in Louisiana, including pastorates in Baton Rouge, Amite, Alexandria, Plaquemine, Crowley, Franklin, Monroe, Ruston and New Orleans. He ioined the executive staff of the General Board of Global Ministries in 1980, directing fund-raising campaigns for local churches across the nation. He passed away at the age 79, in Little Rock, on January 2, 2005.
